MINUTES OF THE MEETING OF THE CITY COUNCIL
CITY OF CARTHAGE, MISSOURI
May 8, 2018

The Carthage City Council met in regular session on the above date at 6:30 P.M. in the City Hall Council Chambers with Mayor Dan Rife presiding. Fire Chief Roger Williams gave the invocation and Police Chief Greg Dagnan led the flag salute.

The following Council Members answered roll call: David Armstrong, Tim Shields, Ceri Otero, Mike Daugherty, Alan Snow, Darren Collier, Brady Beckham, Kirby Newport and James Harrison. Council Member Juan Topete was absent. City Administrator Tom Short and City Attorney Nate Dally were present.

The following Department Heads were present: Police Chief Greg Dagnan, Fire Chief Roger Williams, Public Works Director Zeb Carney, Parks Director Alan Bull and Deputy City Clerk Coby Fullerton.

Mr. Daugherty made a motion, seconded by Mr. Harrison, to approve the minutes of the April 24, 2018 Council Meeting. Motion carried unanimously.

During Citizens Participation Period: Wendy Douglas with the Carthage Convention and Visitors Bureau reported that it was National Tourism Week and the Joplin CVB is celebrating it's 30-year anniversary. She also reported on a CVB strategic planning session to be held Wednesday May 9. She invited everyone to attend Food Truck Friday on May 11th.

Abi Almandinger with Vision Carthage reported on a new program Carthage in Bloom. She also reported that 2 judges with the nonprofit organization America in Bloom will be coming to Carthage July 25 and will tour Carthage for two days and will end with a community forum on July 27. She also reported that she requested \$10,000 in the 2019 budget to beautify Carthage.

Mr. Collier reported the Budget, Ways and Means Committee is between meetings with next meeting scheduled Monday May 14. There will be a meeting Thursday May 10 at 5:30 to discuss the 2019 Fiscal Budget.

Ms. Otero reported the Committee on Insurance/Audit and Claims met on this date in the Council Chambers and approved the claims. She also stated that Mr. Short reported on the roof repairs from the hail damage.

Mr. Harrison reported the Public Safety Committee was between meetings with the next scheduled meeting Monday May 21.

Mr. Beckham reported the Public Services Committee met Monday May 7. He reported there was a request by the radio station for a fundraiser Sunday July 8 from 1 to 5 pm to sell food in Carter Park. Mr. Beckham made a motion, seconded by Mr. Daugherty, to recommend the sale of food in Carter Park July 8 from 1 to 5pm for a radio station fundraiser. Motion passed. He also reported on the YMCA to manage the Carthage pools.

Wendy Douglas with the CVB told the committee of a Bicycle tour coming to Carthage Monday June 18. He also reported on an ordinance to amend the order of council meetings, request council bills or put items on the agenda. This will be brought up in the future as a council bill. The next scheduled meeting will be Monday June 4.

Mr. Daugherty reported the Public Works Committee met Tuesday May 1. He reported that Blevins Asphalt Construction Co., for the Annual Asphalt Paving Contract for fiscal year 2018-2019 and AT Urban Development for sidewalks along Rt. 571 (Grand Ave) from Airport Dr. to about 500 ft. south of George E Phelps Blvd., (TAP-1601 (702) Sidewalk Improvement Project will be presented tonight in Council Bills 18-19 and 18-20. Mr. Daugherty made a motion, seconded by Ms. Otero, to accept a bid for a surplus truck from the Street Department for \$401.95 from Michael Bisbee. Motion passed. Mr. Daugherty made a motion, seconded by Mr. Armstrong, to use annual funds for street paving to overlay a portion of Fairview from Garrison Ave to Grant Ave and Douglas Court to Douglas Place. There is \$60,588.00 remaining in the fund and the repairs will not exceed this amount. Motion passed. The next scheduled meeting will be Tuesday June 5.

Special Committee and Board Liaison reports were given by, Mr. Armstrong for the Planning and Zoning, Ms. Otero for the Library Board, Harry S Truman Coordinating Council, and the Carthage Humane Society, Mr. Harrison for the Jasper County Commissioners' Meeting and Mr. Daugherty for Carthage Chamber of Commerce and Carthage Convention and Visitors Bureau.

Mayor Rife reported he had been working on budgeting issues and read a thank you card from Mike Harris, previous Mayor.

Fire Chief Roger Williams reported progress on construction of Fire Station No. 2.

City Administrator Tom Short reported on the following: There will be a special Budget Meeting Thursday May 10 and the next scheduled meeting will be Monday May 14 to finalize the budget, he met with Mr. Armstrong to prepare the information on the order of business and request for council bill procedure for the Public Service meeting, update on MoDOT TAP Fund Grant and improvements MoDOT will make on sidewalk, curbs, ramps and pedestrian buttons on intersections, Region M shredding event for paper documents and he met with the City Attorney on a personnel issue regarding some classifications.

The Committee on Claims filed a report in the amount of \$583,894.42 against the following funds: General Revenue \$70,084.17, Public Health \$2,193.22, Parks/Stormwater \$145,765.74, Golf Course \$9,410.68, Lodging \$8,333.33, Parks and Rec Fund \$54.48, Library \$30,885.81 and Payroll \$317,166.99. Ms. Otero made a motion, seconded by Mr. Newport, to accept the report and allow the claims. Motion carried.

Under old business, **C.B. 18-15** – An Ordinance to add Section 3-68 of the Carthage Code to allow for Temporary Permits for sale by drink for certain organizations in the

City of Carthage was placed on second reading followed by a roll call vote of 9 yeas and 0 nays. The council bill was approved and numbered Ordinance 18-15.

C.B. 18-16 – An Ordinance transferring the Carthage Municipal Court and transferring the Municipal Division Cases to be heard in the Jasper County Circuit Court Associate Division was placed on second reading. Mr. Beckham expressed his opposition to transferring the Municipal Court to the County Circuit Court, this was followed by a roll call vote. Motion failed on a vote of 0 yeas and 9 nays. Nay: Armstrong, Shields, Otero, Daugherty, Snow, Collier, Newport, Beckham and Harrison.

C.B. 18-17 – An Ordinance authorizing the Mayor to enter into an agreement with G & G Construction, Inc. for Storm Water and Intersection Improvements at Myers Park, 6th and Grant, and Euclid to Highland, Carthage, Missouri was placed on second reading followed by a roll call vote of 9 yeas and 0 nays. The council bill was approved and numbered Ordinance 18-16.

C.B. 18-18 – An Ordinance authorizing the Mayor to enter into an agreement with Guarantee Roofing, Inc. for Roof Repairs to City Buildings, Carthage, Missouri was placed on second reading followed by a roll call vote of 9 yeas and 0 nays. The council bill was approved and numbered Ordinance 18-17.

Under new business, **C.B. 18-19** – An Ordinance authorizing the Mayor to enter into an agreement with Blevins Asphalt Construction Co., Inc. for the Annual Asphalt Paving Contract for fiscal year 2018-2019 (\$51.00 per ton of asphalt to include tack oil) was placed on first reading with no action taken.

C.B. 18-20 – An Ordinance to authorize the Mayor of the City of Carthage, Missouri to execute a contract between the City of Carthage and A.T. Urban Development, Inc., 6891 Highway 125 South, Chadwick, Mo 65629, for sidewalks along Rt. 571 (Grand Ave) from Airport Dr. to about 500 ft. south of George E Phelps Blvd., (TAP-1601 (702) Sidewalk Improvement Project was placed on first reading with no action taken.

Ms. Otero made a motion, seconded by Mr. Harrison, to approve the Mayor's re-appointment of Andy Cloud to the Jasper County Extension Center until May 2020 and the appointment of Josh Cahoon to the Care Leave Committee until May 2020. Motion carried.

Mr. Armstrong made a motion, seconded by Mr. Collier, to approve Resolution 1833 – A Resolution of the Council of the City of Carthage, Missouri authorizing the approval of Change Order to the Construction Contract for the River Street and Fairview Avenue Intersection Improvements Project. Resolution passed.

During closing remarks, Mr. Beckham commented on Council Bill 18-20 that the addresses listed are also shared with bike lanes. He wanted to make sure it would not be a conflict. He also stated there will be 600 cyclist coming in June and how it will help the City economy.

Mr. Harrison made a motion, seconded by Mr. Daugherty, to adjourn the regular session of the Council Meeting. Motion carried and meeting adjourned at 7:12 PM.

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND ARTICLE II, DIVISION 2, SECTIONS 2-34, 2-46 AND ARTICLE II, DIVISION 3, 2-56 OF THE CODE OF CARTHAGE PROVIDING FOR ORDER OF BUSINESS AND OPENING OF MEETINGS IN THE CITY OF CARTHAGE, MISSOURI.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CARTHAGE, JASPER COUNTY, MISSOURI as follows:

SECTION I: Article II, Division 2 – Generally - Section 2-34 of the Code of Carthage Code is hereby repealed and the following enacted in lieu thereof:

Sec. 2-34. - Order of business and opening of meetings.

(a) The following order of business shall be observed at meetings of the council:

- (1) Call to Order.
- (2) Invocation.
- (3) Pledge of allegiance to flag.
- (4) Calling of the roll.
- (5) Reading and consideration of the minutes of previous meeting.
- (6) Presentations/Proclamations.
- (7) Public Comments.
- (8) Reports of standing committees.
- (9) Reports from special committees and board liaisons.
- (10) Report of the Mayor.
- (11) Reports/Remarks of Councilmembers.
- (12) Administrative Reports.
- (13) Report of claims presented against the City.
- (14) Public Hearings.
- (15) Old business.
- (16) New business.
- (17) Appointments.
- (18) Resolutions.
- (19) Closing comments.
- (20) Executive Session.
- (21) Adjournment.

(b) All meetings of the council shall be opened by the mayor by rapping a gavel for attention, then designating some suitable person there present to serve as chaplain to give the invocation, then standing and facing the flag of the United States and leading the persons present in recitation of the pledge of allegiance.

(c) During public comments period, each person addressing the Council shall state their name and address or the organization or firm represented and is limited to no more than five (5) minutes. The time may be extended by the chair if deemed necessary. Once a person has had their say on a particular issue they are not permitted to once again speak on the issue unless called to answer any further questions by the Council or chair.

(d) During Reports/Remarks of Councilmembers, members of the Council may take this opportunity to report on meetings, make comments and/or express concerns regarding current issues impacting the City, or make announcements concerning topics of interest of the Council.

(e) During Closing Comments, members of the Council may take this opportunity to extend compliments, express concerns, or make announcements concerning any topic they wish to share with staff or the public.

(f) No business shall be taken up outside of the regular order, unless by consent of the majority of the council present and voting on such question.

SECTION II: Article II, Division 2 – Generally - Section 2.46 of the Code of Carthage, Presentation of new business, is hereby repealed.

SECTION III: Article II, Division 3 – Committees - Section 2.56 – Generally - of the Code of Carthage sub-section (b) (6) Fire, is hereby repealed.

SECTION IV: This Ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and approval.

POOL MANAGEMENT CONTRACT

This agreement is entered into on this day _____, by and between the Fair Acres Family YMCA, Inc., a Missouri non-profit corporation (hereinafter, "FAFY"), and the City of Carthage (hereinafter, "The City").

WHEREAS, FAFY is engaged in the business of Aquatic Facility Management and,

WHEREAS, The city is the owner of two public swimming pool facilities located at 520 Roberts Ellis Young Dr., Carthage, Missouri and 714 S Garrison, Carthage, Missouri and,

WHEREAS, Owner desires to hire FAFY to manage and maintain the pool, upon the terms and conditions hereinafter set forth. The parties hereto intend that an independent contractor-employer relationship will be created by this contract. The City is interested only in the results to be achieved and the conduct and control of the work will lie solely with FAFY. FAFY is not to be considered an agent of the city for any purpose, and the employees of FAFY are not entitled to any of the benefits that the City provides for its employees, if any.

WHEREAS, it is the purpose of the City to provide, in the most efficient and effective manner, recreational facilities and programs to the residents of the City. The City believes that the scope and effectiveness of its programs can be improved by associating with the FAFY in order to utilize its training, experience and resources. The purpose of this Agreement is to outline the terms of a cooperative arrangement between the parties that is designed to increase, improve and enhance the City's recreational programs.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of these premises and of the agreements hereinafter set forth, the parties agree as follows:

1. ENGAGEMENT. The owner hereby hires FAFY, and FAFY agrees to maintain and operate the pool upon the terms and conditions set forth in the Contract.

2. STAFFING REQUIREMENT. FAFY shall provide YMCA or Red Cross Certified Lifeguard(s), for the management of the pool pursuant to the terms of this contract. Pool manager will be on FAFY salary allowing a decrease in management fees. All personnel provided by FAFY shall be FAFY's employees. FAFY shall be responsible for all hiring and firing and scheduling decisions, paying the employees, providing workers compensation and unemployment insurance, and for adequate supervision and administration of the staff.

3. SCHEDULE AND FEES. The pool will be operated according to the times Set forth in Schedule A (Operational Schedule). The pool shall be opened during the hours specified unless the pool must be closed due to mechanical breakdown, unsafe weather conditions, or contamination as reasonably determined by the FAFY. In the event of unsafe weather conditions, the FAFY staff member on duty shall evacuate the pool and remain on station for 1 hour to determine if the pool may be re-opened that day. If it starts raining after 4:45pm, it will be within the lifeguard's discretion as to

whether to close or keep the pool open. The City will pay FAFY according to Schedule B (Payment schedule). Gate fees, individual and family passes, and all other special passes and fees, are set forth in Schedule C (Fee Schedule); however, The City and FAFY may modify or amend the gate and pass fees by mutually agreed upon written amendment to Schedule C.

4. INSPECTION. The FAFY administrative staff or lifeguards shall inspect the Pool on a daily basis to insure that the terms and provisions of this contract and the policies of FAFY are being properly executed.

5. POOL REGULATIONS. FAFY shall establish and enforce all pool operational procedures and regulations for safety and maintenance. FAFY shall also enforce additional regulations pertaining to the pool, as provided by the City. All FAFY personnel, the City's members, employees, and guests of the City using the pool and its environs shall follow these regulations. FAFY staff is hereby authorized to cause to be removed from the pool or its environs any individual(s) violating the pool regulations as reasonably determined by FAFY's employees, in their sole discretion. FAFY employees maintain the right to permanently remove from the pool any individual as a result of drinking/drug abuse or physical assault, etc.

The FAFY lifeguard has the last word on the pool deck and in the water. Both the FAFY and the lifeguard are held harmless with regard to any consequences arising from this termination or agreement and the lifeguard will immediately cease all activity and vacate the premises.

6. REPAIRS. If the pool must be closed while awaiting mechanical repair, the City's designated representative shall be advised as soon as practicable. FAFY's personnel will not open the pool unless all systems are operating properly. The City shall provide any reasonable repairs to the pool and the surrounding area. Any clean-up due to vandalism and/or repair due to vandalism shall be billed separately from contract and paid for by The City. FAFY shall contact the City's designated representative to arrange inspection prior to clean up. If the pool must be closed for mechanical repair that by no means does that obviate the City's duty to pay FAFY under the terms of schedule B.

7. ROUTINE MAINTENANCE. All necessary chemicals to properly maintain the pool will be supplied by FAFY. FAFY shall maintain the pool according to the regulations of the Missouri State Health. FAFY will provide paper products for the restrooms. The City will provide utilities services, including electric, sewer, trash, natural gas, and a functional, hard-wired telephone with 911 capability, and any additional fees relating to utilities for the duration of the contract to begin one week prior to pool opening. The City will remove water, clean and refill the pool with fresh city water the third week in May. FAFY will initiate the treatment and maintenance of the pool water following the City's initial spring clean-up no earlier than the third week in May.

8. HOLD HARMLESS AGREEMENT. To the fullest extent permitted by law, The FAFY agrees to indemnify, defend and hold harmless the City of Carthage, Missouri, its officers, agents, volunteers, and employees from and against all claims for bodily injuries or property damage or loss, including but not limited to attorney's fees, court costs, or other alternative dispute resolution costs, arising out of, or in any manner related to the use of the pool by the City and the City's residents, invitees, or trespassers, caused in whole or in part by the actual or alleged negligent acts, errors, or omissions of the FAFY, its officers, agents and volunteers, or anyone directly or indirectly employed or hired by the FAFY or anyone for whose acts FAFY may be liable.

To the fullest extent permitted by law, the City of Carthage agrees to indemnify, defend and hold harmless the Fair Acres Family YMCA, its officers, agents, volunteers, and employees from and against all claims for bodily injuries or property damage or loss, including but not limited to attorney's fees, court costs, or other alternative dispute resolution costs, arising out of, or in any manner related to the use of the pool by the City and the City's residents, invitees, or trespassers, caused in whole or in part by the actual or alleged negligent acts, errors, or omissions of the City of Carthage, Missouri, its officers, agents and volunteers, or anyone directly or indirectly employed or hired by the City of Carthage or anyone for whose acts the City of Carthage may be liable.

9. INSURANCE. The City shall maintain, in full force and effect during the term of this contract, a general liability insurance policy, to protect the City, in the face amount of not less than \$2,000,000. FAFY shall also maintain general liability insurance in the face amount of \$2,000,000, in full force for the duration of this contract and will provide the City with certificates of insurance, with the City of Carthage being listed as an additional insured and all proper endorsements being attached, for both general liability and workers' compensation insurance on request. In turn the City will provide the Fair Acres Family YMCA with certificates of insurance, with the Fair Acres Family YMCA being listed as an additional insured and all proper endorsements being attached, for both general liability and workers' compensation insurance on request.

10. PROGRAMMING. FAFY is solely authorized to conduct swimming instruction and water exercise programs on Mondays through Saturdays. Private parties will be scheduled by FAFY and staffed by FAFY personnel at the rate of \$125.00 for 2 hours. In general, the FAFY agrees to provide the personnel necessary to organize, publicize, manage and operate the City's swimming pool facilities. Also, the FAFY agrees to be liable for the operating costs incurred by these programs. Carthage summer Aquatic Swim Team will have access to the municipal pool for practices and meets. Times and dates will need to be agreed upon with FAFY staff.

11. TERMINATION. The City shall have the right to terminate this contract at any time for cause, and any of the following acts by FAFY shall constitute cause for termination of this contract:

- A. The assignment by FAFY of this Contract, or any rights there under, without the City's written consent, or
- B. The appointment of a receiver for FAFY, or an application therefore, or the filing of a petition by or against FAFY under the federal bankruptcy Act, or,
- C. The assignment for the benefit of creditors, or,
- D. Natural Disaster and/or acts of mother nature, or,
- E. The breach of any terms or conditions contained herein.

Cancellation of this contract by the City for any reason other than the Causes expressly stated above shall constitute a breach of this contract, in which case the balance of the Contract shall become immediately due and payable.

In the event of a litigation to enforce the payment terms of this contract, the prevailing party shall be entitled to a reasonable attorney's fee and costs, if any.

12. OWNER'S DESIGNATED REPRESENTATIVE. The City shall designate an Agent(s) who shall be an employee of the City, for the purpose of this contract. The FAFY Director of Aquatics shall address to and all patron complaints or suggestions. The City's designated agent may be changed from time to time at the discretion of the City.

REQUESTS FOR COUNCIL BILLS

1. Any Council member, individually or on behalf of a Committee, and/or City Department Head desiring to introduce a Council Bill to the City Council, that may resolve a problem or address a concern, shall first secure a "Request for Council Bill/Agenda item" form from the City Clerk's Office.
2. Each Council member or Department Head shall describe on the request form those specifics necessary to convey the subject matter to be accomplished. Then return the request form to the City Clerk's office for the Mayor's signature.
3. The Mayor will then forward the Requested Council Bill form to the City Administrator who will develop or assign the development of the essential information required for the appropriate committee to consider and return it to the Mayor. A draft ordinance will be prepared by the City Attorney, or the department responsible for the ordinance, with legal assistance from the City Attorney.
4. The Requested Council Bill will then be given a number and the Mayor will assign it to the appropriate committee for consideration.
5. The assigned committee will place the Requested Council Bill on the agenda for its next scheduled meeting and copies of this agenda with the Council Bill included will be sent to all Council members advising them that this specific Council Bill will be discussed.
6. During the committee meeting in which the Requested Council Bill is discussed, the committee should take appropriate action on the Council Bill and recommend its findings to the full Council.
7. After the committee has taken the appropriate action on the Requested Council Bill, the Bill should then be submitted to the City Attorney for final preparation and submission to the Council for its next scheduled meeting.
8. The committee should prepare minutes of its meeting in which the Requested Council Bill was discussed and submit these to the City Clerk for inclusion in the Council packet for its next scheduled meeting.
9. After the City Attorney has prepared the Requested Council Bill in proper form, it is placed on the Council agenda for the next scheduled meeting of the Council.
10. Amendments to Council Bills presented by Council members on the floor of the Council meeting shall be presented in typewritten form (with copies for all the Council and Staff) on a separate sheet of paper indicating the specific sections of the proposed bill that are being requested to be added to, deleted or changed.
11. The Council shall present a main motion for consideration of the Proposed Council Bill and then the requested amendment.

1. 4. The assigned committee will place the Item on the agenda for its next scheduled meeting and copies of

5. During the committee meeting in which the Requested Item is discussed, the committee should take appropriate action and if needed, recommend its findings to the full Council.

7. If the Item requires action by the full Council, said action shall be presented for consideration of the full Council.

Public participation

Mr. Armstrong addressed the Committee in regards to the operation of the pool by the YMCA. Mr. Armstrong stated that the pool closed early last year due to the Mayor stating he didn't want the City to lose any more money. Mr. Armstrong felt strongly that the pool should stay open through Labor Day if at all possible. Mr. Bull stated the YMCA chose to close the pool due to a lack of swimmers and funding had no bearing on it. Mr. Beckham asked if this could be brought up when the pool agreement was discussed.

NEW BUSINESS:

1. Consider and discuss request for sale of food in Carter Park for fund raiser - Mr. Bonilla requested permission to sell food on July 8th in Carter Park for a fund raiser to help with the local Hispanic radio station. Mr. Beckham asked if this was the same fund raiser as they had done in the past. Mr. Bonilla explained it was the same and would be held just as the past ones were. Mr. Beckham asked Mr. Bull if there had been any problems in the past and Mr. Bull assured the Committee there had never been a problem with this group.

Mr. Daugherty moved to recommend to Council allowing the Mr. Bonilla to sell food in Carter Park on July 8th for a fund raiser to help support the local Hispanic radio station. Motion carried.

2. Consider and discuss pool agreement for YMCA management of Carthage pools- Mr. Bull reported he has been pleased with YMCA managing the pools and he would like to see the relationship between the YMCA and City continue. Mr. Bull stated he had no idea there had ever been a discussion on keeping the pool open or closing it due to funding. Mr. Armstrong states that the agreement hasn't had the funding raised since the YMCA started management. Mr. Bull reported that it had been raised, last year, which also included a "true up" so the YMCA doesn't end up in the negative at the end of the season. There was quite a bit of discussion centering on the closing date of the pool. All the Committee members stated they were pleased with the management of the pools by the YMCA.

Mr. Harrison moved to recommend to Council entering into an agreement with the Fair Acres Family Y for management of the City pools for the 2018 season. Motion carried.

3. Consider and discuss bicycle tour through Carthage as requested by CVB- Ms. Douglas approached the Committee to discuss the 2018 BAM bicycle event that would be coming through Carthage on Monday, June 18th. Ms. Douglas explained the route and the timing involved. The route starts in Joplin and Carthage will be just about nineteen miles into the ride. Mr. Beckham stated that this would be just right for the riders to eat breakfast. Ms. Douglas stated she had been in contact with the restaurants on the square and they would be serving that morning. Mr. stated he thought some tables on the inside of the square and some extra trash cans would be a good idea. Ms. Douglas stated she really didn't need any action from the Committee but wanted to give them information and keep them in the loop.

4. Consider and discuss an Ordinance to amend Article II, Division 2, Sections 2-46 and Article II, Division 3, 2-56 of the Code of Carthage providing for the order of business and opening of meetings in the City of Carthage, Missouri- Mr. Short presented a possible change to City Code that would be used as a template for meetings and possibly streamline the way a Council Bill is handled. Mr. Short did note the City Attorney had made a suggestion for one small change. Mr. Short felt this new form for Council Bill request would help with frustration that has happened in the past in getting a Council Bill moved forward. This new meeting format would also take care of some possible Sunshine Law violations. Mr. Armstrong stated he thought these were good changes and would help make things smoother. The Committee discussed several things associated with the possible Bill, including worrying of having items come up time after time. There was also discussion about City Policies. Mr. Collier called the meeting to order at 5:30 P.M.

***NOTE:** All areas *“italic”* below were submitted to the Committee in a pre-meeting memo by Mr. Short.

OLD BUSINESS:

Approval of minutes from previous meeting: Mr. Topete made a motion to approve the minutes for the May 10 Special Meeting of the Budget Ways & Means Committee. Motion carried 4-0.

Consider and discuss perfection of Fiscal 2019 Budget:

*“The updated summary schedules for Fiscal 2019 Budget are attached. These reflect the final changes the Committee made when it approved the budget at the last meeting. A Council Bill is also **attached** for adoption of the budget for first reading for the first City Council meeting in June. The General Fund has budgeted appropriations of \$9,877,843. Revenues are \$8,650,320. The budgeted difference coming out of the fund balance is \$1,227,523. The Agency requests are in the appropriate budgets as discussed by the Committee. The CVB and Over-Sixty Center are the same amounts as last fiscal year. The Humane Society and the Chamber of Commerce have been increased. The Humane Society is increased \$1,500 with a six month review, and the Chamber increased \$6,355. The Library is no longer shown as an “Agency” pursuant to the MOU previously agreed to by the Board and the City. Staff is in the process of preparing the final documents and schedules as approved by the Committee to complete the Budget Book for Fiscal 2019 for Council consideration in June.”*

Mr. Short reviewed the list of approved capital items totaling \$4,961,461 for all funds. The addition of the IT Department was also discussed. Travel and training budgets were reviewed noting only a small increase. Agency agreements had been sent out, and the Humane Society again requested the committee reconsider their request. There was discussion regarding decreasing fund balances to pay for capital projects. Mr. Snow made a motion to move forward with the budget as presented. Motion carried.

NEW BUSINESS:

Consider and discuss agreements with agencies in conjunction with adoption of Fiscal 2019 Budget.

“Included are drafts of the various Agreements with the Agencies as a part of the Fiscal 2019 Budget.

*The Agreement with the **Chamber of Commerce** for Economic Development Services is the same agreement format as has existed for several years with the change in price as discussed at the Committee hearings. The agreement provides for the "Agreement...to continue in full force and effect upon reconfirmation by both parties on or before July 1 of each year. If either party determines that it will not reconfirm this Agreement, it shall notify the other party at least sixty (60) days prior to the expiration of the Agreement". The other Agreements are for the **Humane Society (at \$31,500)**, with a provision that upon review at six months to include the additional \$1,500 requested. The initial contract is for \$31,500. The **Convention and Visitors Bureau (CVB)** Agreement is for \$152,000, which includes \$102,000 from Lodging Tax funds and \$50,000 from the General Fund for the Wayfinding program. The Lodging Tax portion will include a slight increase (from the current year) based on budgeted estimates where only the actual amount received from the tax will be transmitted to the CVB. A separate section relates to the Wayfinding program requirements, which will require specific separate Council action prior to the commitment of expenditure of funds. The **Over 60 Center Agreement (\$21,000)** is the same as the current year's Agreement. Council Bills will be prepared for these agreements for Council consideration for the first Council meeting in June after the Committee's consideration and approval. The Agencies will be sent copies of the Draft Agreements for comments prior to the Committee meeting. There should be no major changes to the contracts. They will take these to their respective Boards at the appropriate times."*

Agency contracts were reviewed. Mr. Snow moved to send the Economic Development agreement with the Chamber of Commerce to the council. Motion carried. Mr. Shields moved to accept and move forward to the council the agreement for \$31,500 for the Carthage Humane Society with a 6 month review. Motion carried. Mr. Shields moved to send the agreement with the Convention and Visitors Bureau for \$152,000 to the council. This amount includes \$102,000 from Lodging Tax Funds and \$50,000 from the General Fund for the Wayfinding Sign program. Motion carried. Mr. Snow made a motion to approve the agreement with the Over Sixty Center for \$21,000. Motion carried.

Staff Reports:

*"The **monthly Sales Tax report** for the month of May for The General Fund's 1% was discussed at the previous meeting. Overall, Sales Tax receipts are still projected to fall short of budget by about 2.47%. I've included the graph again for May's receipts. Also included is the **April Summary Budget Report**. This report shows the revenues and expenditures for all funds for which appropriations are made. April reflects the 83.33% level of the budget year. At this point, fund budgets appear to be in line with what was originally adopted. A couple of funds are over the 83% mark for expenditures, and we'll report on these at the meeting. Within the General Fund, a couple of departments are over the 83% mark. We'll also discuss those at the meeting. The Golf Course's expenditure budget is within parameters, but its revenues are still short. It is still being monitored to control as much as it can. Alan reported for Mark Peterson that the process of implementing the more flexible fee pricing model (My Pricing) for the Golf Course has just been completed. We expect to see some results of it shortly. As a result of some of the above, there may be a need for a final budget adjustment for the June Committee meeting."*

Mr. Short reviewed sales tax revenues. He is estimating sales tax revenues to fall short of budget projections by approximately 2.5%. Current financials were reviewed discussing areas where revenues fall short of projections and expenditures are exceeding projections.





"Rosenberg's Rules of Order"

(Simple Rules of Parliamentary Procedure for the 21st Century)

Introduction

The rules of procedure at meetings should be simple enough for most people to understand. Unfortunately, that has not always been the case. Virtually all clubs, associations, boards, councils and bodies follow a set of rules - "Robert's Rules of Order" - which are embodied in a small, but complex, book. Virtually no one I know has actually read this book cover to cover. Worse yet, the book was written for another time, and for another purpose. If one is chairing or running a Parliament, then "Robert's Rules of Order" is a dandy and quite useful handbook for procedure in that complex setting. On the other hand, if one is running a meeting of, say, a 5-member body with a few members of the public in attendance, a simplified version of the rules of parliamentary procedure is in order.

Hence, the birth of "Rosenberg's Rules of Order."

What follows is my version of the rules of parliamentary procedure, based on my 20 years of experience chairing meetings in state and local government. These rules have been simplified for the smaller bodies we chair or in which we participate, slimmed down for the 21st Century, yet retaining the basic tenets of order to which we have grown accustomed.

This treatise on modern parliamentary procedure is built on a foundation supported by the following four pillars: (1) Rules should establish order. The first purpose of rules of parliamentary procedure is to establish a framework for the orderly conduct of meetings. (2) Rules should be clear. Simple rules lead to wider understanding and participation. Complex rules create two classes: those who understand and participate; and those who do not fully understand and do not fully participate. (3) Rules should be user friendly. That is, the rules must be simple enough that the public is invited into the body and feels that it has participated in the process. (4) Rules should enforce the will of the majority while protecting the rights of the minority. The ultimate purpose of rules of procedure is to encourage discussion and to facilitate decision-making by the body. In a democracy, majority rules. The rules must enable the majority to express itself and fashion a result, while permitting the minority to also express itself, but not dominate, and fully participate in the process.

The Role of the Chair

While all members of the body should know and understand the rules of parliamentary procedure, it is the Chair of the body who is charged with applying the rules in the conduct of the meeting. The Chair should be well versed in those rules. The Chair, for all intents and purposes, makes the final ruling on the rules every time the Chair states an action. In fact, all decisions by the Chair are final unless overruled by the body itself.

Since the Chair runs the conduct of the meeting, it is usual courtesy for the Chair to play a less active role in the debate and discussion than other members of the body. This does not mean that the Chair should not participate in the debate or discussion. To the contrary, the Chair as a member of the body has the full right to participate in the debate, discussion and decision-making of the body. What the Chair should do, however, is strive to be the last to speak at the discussion and debate stage, and the Chair should not make or second a motion unless the Chair is convinced that no other member of the body will do so at that point in time.

The Basic Format for an Agenda Item Discussion

Formal meetings normally have a written, often published agenda. Informal meetings may have only an oral or understood agenda. In either case, the meeting is governed by the agenda and the agenda constitutes the body's agreed-upon roadmap for the meeting. And each agenda item can be handled by the Chair in the following basic format:

First, the Chair should clearly announce the agenda item number and should clearly state what the agenda item subject is. The Chair should then announce the format (which follows) that will be followed in considering the agenda item.

Second, following that agenda format, the Chair should invite the appropriate person or persons to report on the item, including any recommendation that they might have. The appropriate person or persons may be the Chair, a member of the body, a staff person, or a committee chair charged with providing input on the agenda item.

Third, the Chair should ask members of the body if they have any technical questions of clarification. At this point, members of the body may ask clarifying questions to the person or persons who reported on the item, and that person or persons should be given time to respond.

Fourth, the Chair should invite public comments, or if appropriate at a formal meeting, should open the public meeting for public input. If numerous members of the public indicate a desire to speak to the subject, the Chair may limit the time of public speakers. At the conclusion of the public comments, the Chair should announce that public input has concluded (or the public hearing as the case may be is closed).

Fifth, the Chair should invite a motion. The Chair should announce the name of the member of the body who makes the motion.

Sixth, the Chair should determine if any member of the body wishes to second the motion. The Chair should announce the name of the member of the body who seconds the motion. (It is normally good practice for a motion to require a second before proceeding with it, to ensure that it is not just one member of the body who is interested in a particular approach. However, a second is not an absolute requirement, and the Chair can proceed with consideration and vote on a motion even when there is no second. This is a matter left to the discretion of the Chair.)

Seventh, if the motion is made and seconded, the Chair should make sure everyone understands the motion. This is done in one of three ways: (1) The Chair can ask the maker of the motion to repeat it. (2) The Chair can repeat the motion. (3) The Chair can ask the secretary or the clerk of the body to repeat the motion.

Eighth, the Chair should now invite discussion of the motion by the body. If there is no desired discussion, or after the discussion has ended, the Chair should announce that the body will vote on the motion. If there has been no discussion or very brief discussion, then the vote on the motion should proceed immediately and there is no need to repeat the motion. If there has been substantial discussion, then it is normally best to make sure everyone understands the motion by repeating it.

Ninth, the Chair takes a vote. Simply asking for the "ayes", and then asking for the "nays" normally does this. If members of the body do not vote, then they "abstain". Unless the rules of the body provide otherwise (or unless a super-majority is required as delineated later in these rules) then a simple majority determines whether the motion passes or is defeated.

Tenth, the Chair should announce the result of the vote and should announce what action (if any) the body has taken. In announcing the result, the Chair should indicate the names of the members of the body, if any, who voted in the minority on the motion. This announcement might take the following form: "The motion passes by a vote of 3-2, with Smith and Jones dissenting. We have passed the motion requiring 10 days notice for all future meetings of this body."

Motions in General

Motions are the vehicles for decision-making by a body. It is usually best to have a motion before the body prior to commencing discussion of an agenda item. This helps the body focus.

Motions are made in a simple two-step process. First, the Chair should recognize the member of the body. Second, the member of the body makes a motion by preceding the member's desired approach with the words: "I move" So, a typical motion might be: "I move that we give 10-day's notice in the future for all our meetings."

The Chair usually initiates the motion by either (1) Inviting the members of the body to make a motion. "A motion at this time would be in order." (2) Suggesting a motion to the members of the body. "A motion would be in order that we give 10-day's notice in the future for all our meetings." (3) Making the motion. As noted, the Chair has every right as a member of the body to make a motion, but should normally do so only if the Chair wishes to make a motion on an item but is convinced that no other member of the body is willing to step forward to do so at a particular time.

The Three Basic Motions

There are three motions that are the most common and recur often at meetings:

The basic motion. The basic motion is the one that puts forward a decision for the body's consideration. A basic motion might be: "I move that we create a 5-member committee to plan and put on our annual fundraiser."

The motion to amend. If a member wants to change a basic motion that is before the body, they would move to amend it. A motion to amend might be: "I move that we amend the motion to have a 10-member committee." A motion to amend takes the basic motion which is before the body and seeks to change it in some way.

The substitute motion. If a member wants to completely do away with the basic motion that is before the body, and put a new motion before the body, they would move a substitute motion. A substitute motion might be: "I move a substitute motion that we cancel the annual fundraiser this year."

"Motions to amend" and "substitute motions" are often confused. But they are quite different, and their effect (if passed) is quite different. A motion to amend seeks to retain the basic motion on the floor, but modify it in some way. A substitute motion seeks to throw out the basic motion on the floor, and substitute a new and different motion for it. The decision as to whether a motion is really a "motion to amend" or a "substitute motion" is left to the chair. So that if a member makes what that member calls a "motion to amend", but the Chair determines that it is really a "substitute motion", then the Chair's designation governs.

Multiple Motions Before the Body

There can be up to three motions on the floor at the same time. The Chair can reject a fourth motion until the Chair has dealt with the three that are on the floor and has resolved them.

When there are two or three motions on the floor (after motions and seconds) at the same time, the vote should proceed first on the last motion that is made. So, for example, assume the first motion is a basic "motion to have a 5-member committee to plan and put on our annual fundraiser." During the discussion of this motion, a member might make a second motion to "amend the main motion to have a 10-member committee, not a 5-member committee to plan and put

on our annual fundraiser." And perhaps, during that discussion, a member makes yet a third motion as a "substitute motion that we not have an annual fundraiser this year." The proper procedure would be as follows:

First, the Chair would deal with the third (the last) motion on the floor, the substitute motion. After discussion and debate, a vote would be taken first on the third motion. If the substitute motion passed, it would be a substitute for the basic motion and would eliminate it. The first motion would be moot, as would the second motion (which sought to amend the first motion), and the action on the agenda item would be completed on the passage by the body of the third motion (the substitute motion). No vote would be taken on the first or second motions. On the other hand, if the substitute motion (the third motion) failed then the Chair would proceed to consideration of the second (now, the last) motion on the floor, the motion to amend.

Second, if the substitute motion failed, the Chair would now deal with the second (now, the last) motion on the floor, the motion to amend. The discussion and debate would focus strictly on the amendment (should the committee be 5 members or 10 members). If the motion to amend passed the Chair would now move to consider the main motion (the first motion) as amended. If the motion to amend failed the Chair would now move to consider the main motion (the first motion) in its original format, not amended.

Third, the Chair would now deal with the first motion that was placed on the floor. The original motion would either be in its original format (5-member committee), or, if amended, would be in its amended format (10-member committee). And the question on the floor for discussion and decision would be whether a committee should plan and put on the annual fundraiser.

To Debate or Not to Debate

The basic rule of motions is that they are subject to discussion and debate. Accordingly, basic motions, motions to amend, and substitute motions are all eligible, each in their turn, for full discussion before and by the body. The debate can continue as long as members of the body wish to discuss an item, subject to the decision of the Chair that it is time to move on and take action.

There are exceptions to the general rule of free and open debate on motions. The exceptions all apply when there is a desire of the body to move on. The following motions are not debatable (that is, when the following motions are made and seconded, the Chair must immediately call for a vote of the body without debate on the motion):

A motion to adjourn. This motion, if passed, requires the body to immediately adjourn to its next regularly scheduled meeting. It requires a simple majority vote.

A motion to recess. This motion, if passed, requires the body to immediately take a recess. Normally, the Chair determines the length of the recess which may be a few minutes or an hour. It requires a simple majority vote.

A motion to fix the time to adjourn. This motion, if passed, requires the body to adjourn the meeting at the specific time set in the motion. For example, the motion might be: "I move we adjourn this meeting at midnight." It requires a simple majority vote.

A motion to table. This motion, if passed, requires discussion of the agenda item to be halted and the agenda item to be placed on "hold". The motion can contain a specific time in which the item can come back to the body: "I move we table this item until our regular meeting in October." Or the motion can contain no specific time for the return of the item, in which case a motion to take the item off the table and bring it back to the body will have to be taken at a future meeting. A motion to table an item (or to bring it back to the body) requires a simple majority vote.

A motion to limit debate. The most common form of this motion is to say: "I move the previous question" or "I move the question" or "I call the question." When a member of the body makes such a motion, the member is really saying: "I've had enough debate. Let's get on with the vote". When such a motion is made, the Chair should ask for a second, stop debate, and vote on the motion to limit debate. The motion to limit debate requires a 2/3 vote of the body. Note: that a motion to limit debate could include a time limit. For example: "I move we limit debate on this agenda item to 15 minutes." Even in this format, the motion to limit debate requires a 2/3 vote of the body. A similar motion is a motion to object to consideration of an item. This motion is not debatable, and if passed, precludes the body from even considering an item on the agenda. It also requires a 2/3 vote.

Majority and Super-Majority Votes

In a democracy, a simple majority vote determines a question. A tie vote means the motion fails. So in a 7-member body, a vote of 4-3 passes the motion. A vote of 3-3 with one abstention means the motion fails. If one member is absent and the vote is 3-3, the motion still fails.

All motions require a simple majority, but there are a few exceptions. The exceptions come up when the body is taking an action which, effectively, cuts off the ability of a minority of the body to take an action or discuss an item. These extraordinary motions require a 2/3 majority (a super-majority) to pass:

Motion to limit debate. Whether a member says "I move the previous question" or "I move the question" or "I call the question" or "I move to limit debate", it all amounts to an attempt to cut off the ability of the minority to discuss an item, and it requires a 2/3 vote to pass.

Motion to close nominations. When choosing officers of the body (like the Chair) nominations are in order either from a nominating committee or from the floor of the body. A motion to close nominations effectively cuts off the right of the minority to nominate officers, and it requires a 2/3 vote to pass.

Motion to object to the consideration of a question. Normally, such a motion is unnecessary since the objectionable item can be tabled, or defeated straight up. However, when members of a body do not even want an item on the agenda to be considered, then such a motion is in order. It is not debatable, and it requires a 2/3 vote to pass.

Motion to suspend the rules. This motion is debatable, but requires a 2/3 vote to pass. If the body has its own rules of order, conduct or procedure, this motion allows the body to suspend the rules for a particular purpose. For example, the body (a private club) might have a rule prohibiting the attendance at meetings by non-club members. A motion to suspend the rules would be in order to allow a non-club member to attend a meeting of the club on a particular date or on a particular agenda item.

The Motion to Reconsider

There is a special and unique motion that requires a bit of explanation all by itself: the motion to reconsider. A tenet of parliamentary procedure is finality. After vigorous discussion, debate, perhaps disagreement and a vote, there must be some closure to the issue. And so, after a vote is taken, the matter is deemed closed, subject only to a re-opener if a proper motion to reconsider is made.

A motion to reconsider requires a majority vote to pass, but there are two special rules that apply only to the motion to reconsider. First, is timing. A motion to reconsider must be made at the meeting where the item was first voted upon or at the very next meeting of the body. A motion to reconsider made at a later time is untimely. (The body, however, can always vote to suspend the rules and by a 2/3 majority, can allow a motion to reconsider to be made at another time.) Second, a motion to reconsider can only be made by certain members of the body. Accordingly, a motion to reconsider can only be made by a member who voted in the majority on the original motion. If such a member has a change of heart, he or she can make the motion to reconsider (any other member of the body may second the motion). If a member who voted in the minority seeks to make the motion to reconsider, it must be ruled out of order. The purpose of this rule is finality. If a member of the minority could make a motion to reconsider, then the item could be brought back to the body again and again. That would defeat the purpose of finality.

If the motion to reconsider passes, then the original matter is back before the body, and a new original motion is then in order. The matter can be discussed and debated as if it were on the floor for the first time.

Courtesy and Decorum

The rules of order are meant to create an atmosphere where the members of the body and the members of the public can attend to business efficiently, fairly and with full participation. At the same time, it is up to the Chair and the members of the body to maintain common courtesy and decorum. Unless the setting is very informal, it is always best for only one person at a time to have the floor, and it is always best for every speaker to be first recognized by the Chair before proceeding to speak.

The Chair should always ensure that debate and discussion of an agenda item focuses on the item and the policy in question, not the personalities of the members of the body. Debate on policy is healthy, debate on personalities is not. The Chair has the right to cut off discussion that is too personal, is too loud, or is too crude.

Debate and discussion should be focused, but free and open. In the interest of time, the Chair may, however, limit the time allotted to speakers, including members of the body.

Can a member of the body interrupt the speaker? The general rule is "no." There are, however, exceptions. A speaker may be interrupted for the following reasons:

Privilege. The proper interruption would be: "point of privilege." The Chair would then ask the interrupter to "state your point." Appropriate points of privilege relate to anything that would interfere with the normal comfort of the meeting. For example, the room may be too hot or too cold, or a blowing fan might interfere with a person's ability to hear.

Order. The proper interruption would be: "point of order." Again, the Chair would ask the interrupter to "state your point." Appropriate points of order relate to anything that would not be considered appropriate conduct of the meeting. For example, if the Chair moved on to a vote on a motion that permits debate without allowing that discussion or debate.

Appeal. If the Chair makes a ruling that a member of the body disagrees with, that member may appeal the ruling of the chair. If the motion is seconded, and after debate, if it passes by a simple majority vote, then the ruling of the Chair is deemed reversed.

Call for orders of the day. This is simply another way of saying, "Let's return to the agenda." If a member believes that the body has drifted from the agreed-upon agenda, such a call may be made. It does not require a vote, and when the Chair discovers that the agenda has not been followed, the Chair simply reminds the body to return to the agenda item properly before them. If the Chair fails to do so, the Chair's determination may be appealed.

Withdraw a motion. During debate and discussion of a motion, the maker of the motion on the floor, at any time, may interrupt a speaker to withdraw his or her motion from the floor. The motion is immediately deemed withdrawn, although the Chair may ask the person who seconded the motion if he or she wishes to make the motion, and any other member may make the motion if properly recognized.

Special Notes About Public Input

The rules outlined above will help make meetings very public-friendly. But in addition, and particularly for the Chair, it is wise to remember three special rules that apply to each agenda item:

Rule One: Tell the public what the body will be doing.

Rule Two: Keep the public informed while the body is doing it.

Rule Three: When the body has acted, tell the public what the body did.
